Certainty in the Midst of Change

We live in a world that is constantly changing. The past year brought unprecedented change, and we had to learn to adapt in our lives, jobs and congregations. In the midst of so much change, Presbyterians Sharing has continued to support the mission and ministry we do together—often in new and adaptive ways. DAILY PRAYERS:

Monday, February 22 We pray for new ministers who may feel overwhelmed and alone in their first pastoral charge.

Tuesday, February 23 We pray for the people, ministries and mission of the Presbytery of Essex-Kent in Ont.

Wednesday, February 24 (Black History Month) We celebrate and give thanks for the contributions and prophetic witness of Black people in Canada.

Thursday, February 25 We pray for the Presbytery of Western Han-Ca's Ministry Committee. May they feel a strong sense of God's presence to strengthen, focus and lead their discernment.

Friday, February 26 Eternal God, in the worry and anxiety of life, we pray for assurance that comes by faith alone: "Return, O my soul, to your rest, for the Lord has dealt bountifully with you" (Psalm 116:7).

Saturday, February 27 We remember in prayer the United Nations International Decade for People of African Descent (2015–2024) and give thanks for those working to promote and protect the rights of people of African descent.
