

## Leading Healthy Lives in Guatemala

In the highlands of Guatemala, 43-year-old Adelina López Vásquez lives with her husband Rafael and their family. Adelina is a health and nutrition promoter in her community. Through training workshops, Adelina gained knowledge and skills about how to prepare wholesome and nutritious foods. She learned the importance of maintaining a clean workspace and the benefits of cooking foods made with fresh, local ingredients instead of buying prepared foods. In addition, the training Adelina received on the topics of home hygiene and nutritious diets have helped both her and her community navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. Today, she shares all she's learned with her community so they can also lead healthy lives. Presbyterian World Service & Development works in partnership with local Mayan organization, AMMID.

# MCCULLOUGH BURSARY RECIPIENTS "CONGRATULATIONS"

The Mccullough Bursary was established in 1997 in memory of John, Susan and Heather McCullough who lost their lives in a tragic road accident in Namibia, southern Africa. It supports students who are preparing for careers in education, ministry and missions, especially those planning to work with children. These are the 2021 recipients.

**DANA HEPDITCH** is an Arts graduate of the University of Ottawa and has been working in the fields of finance and real estate. She is the mother of two young girls and has decided to make a career change to become an elementary school teacher. She is currently studying in the **Tyndale Bachelor of Education program**.

**TRACEY KENNEDY** is a graduate of the University of Western Ontario, completing her Master of Music in Literature and Performance, specializing in flute. She has used her music skills to teach private lessons and volunteer in various settings with children and teens. Through one experience she developed a desire to create resources for students with intellectual, physical or sensory challenges, incorporating music from many cultures. She is in the **Bachelor of Education program at Tyndale University**.

**KEPHA MWANGI** is a student in Nairobi, Kenya, working on his **Master's thesis at Kenya Methodist University.** On completion he plans to continue with his doctorate in Theology to teach Christian doctrine and theology at a University.

**ABI TO** completed a Bachelor's degree in Early Childhood Education at Ryerson University., working in this field for several years. She also directed a respite program for families with special needs children.
