



The Leading with Care policy is not about us as individuals. It is about us as a body of Christ—a denomination—trying to ensure the highest quality of ministry by offering our best to Christ and working to make sure that the worst does not happen. It is a time for entering the age of lost innocence, whether real or imagined.

The Presbyterian Church in Canada is committed to providing safe environments for all persons, including children, youth, vulnerable adults, and those who minister to and with them. The church's ministry includes times of worship, service, study and play in all milieus (e.g. church courts, congregations, camps) that fall under the jurisdiction of The Presbyterian Church in Canada. All staff, both volunteer and paid, must support this policy.

MISSION MOMENTS

Sunday, December 03, 2023

In Malawi, Jennifer joined a program for orphans and vulnerable children (OVC) supported by *PWS&D*. When she was in Grade 5, Jennifer lost both of her parents to HIV and was cared for by her great-aunt. Jennifer is also HIV positive and is undergoing treatment. Through the OVC program, Jennifer received training in tailoring as well as beekeeping. Now 19 years old, Jennifer has just had her first honey harvest, yielding 5 kg of honey, which she sold to buy food. Jennifer now dreams of volunteering with a local tailor, hoping to secure a paid job in the field. With the skills she learned from this program, Jennifer is able to live positively with HIV and earn a livelihood to support herself.

DAILY PRAYER TOPICS

Saturday, December 2 – Pray for ministers and sessions who are experiencing discord in their congregations, that God may bring about reconciliation and healing so that they may emerge once again as the hands and feet of Christ.

Sunday, December 3 – Advent I – As we light the candle of hope, pray that we may know best how to prepare for this season, and that what God has done through giving His Son to us may be fully expressed before our congregations and our communities.

Monday, December 4 – Pray that our ministries with indigenous Canadians in Kenora, Winnipeg, northern Saskatchewan, and British Columbia may provide love, hope, and listening ears, as well as food and basic needs.

Tuesday, December 5 – As we live out the days of Advent, pray that we may find a new vision for the church and see what God is calling us to do.

Wednesday, December 6 – Pray for the Renewal Fellowship Board chair, the Rev. Sandra Copland Dufour, as she guides the Board, that God may reveal His perfect will to her, the Board members, and staff.

Thursday, December 7 – Pray for retired ministers and their families across Canada, that God may continue to use them to encourage their congregations.

Friday, December 8 – Pray for congregations seeking to engage today's culture with the good news of Jesus Christ, that God may show them how to connect with people of all ages and backgrounds in conversation, and may pour out His love through them.

Saturday, December 9 – Pray for the Rev. Bill Grace and the leaders at St. Luke's Presbyterian Church, Oshawa, Ontario, as they seek to serve their community in many innovative ways during this Advent season.
